

TEAM INDIA WILL HOPE TO AVENGE 2019

Kiwis had beaten India in the semifinal with MS Dhoni famously being run out by Martin Guptill

India's team is gearing up for a chance at redemption against New Zealand, aiming to overturn their 2019 World Cup semifinal setback. The stage is set for a potential rematch at Wankhede on 15 November.

After the Kiwis registered a five-wicket win against a hapless Sri Lanka in Bengaluru, they have pretty much confirmed their place in the last four as Pakistan's chances of making it are very slim with almost unattainable margins.

In their match against England, Pakistan will have to win by a margin of 287 runs if they bat first and if they are chasing they need to dismiss England for 50 runs and chase the target in two overs or 100 runs in three overs.

With the equation looking

highly unlikely for Pakistan to make it, New Zealand have almost certainly made it to the semis and that sets up a titanic clash against hosts India at the iconic venue, Wankhede Stadium.

The last time India and New Zealand clashed in this World Cup was in the league stage at Dharamsala where India defeated the Kiwis by four wickets.

Virat Kohli was in his element as he struck 95 and Rohit Sharma had slammed a quick-fire 46 that gave the

team the initial impetus.

And that was a victory the Indians had registered in an ICC event against New Zealand after a gap of 20 years.

When it comes to ICC knockout games, New Zealand have been India's nemesis since forever.

As far back as the 2000 ICC Champions Trophy final in Nairobi to as recent as the 2019 World Cup semifinal, New Zealand and knockouts have not been in India's favour.

However, this is a very different Indian team and they are out to change history in the coming days.

With all departments working like a well-oiled machine, Team India would be looking to put it past the dangerous New Zealand team.



The batting is on fire with the top order led by skipper Rohit Sharma giving India electrifying starts that keeps the run-rate stable and healthy even through the middle overs.

Virat Kohli is in fine fettle after his hundred against South Africa with a total of 543 runs in this World Cup and with a possibility of breaking Sachin Tendulkar's record of

most runs in an ODI World Cup of 673.

Kohli has a maximum of three games to achieve that feat and he has the opportunity to score his 50th ODI hundred as well and there would be no bigger stage than a World Cup semifinal to do it.

The bowling which has been red-hot in this World Cup for India and turning on the heat would be expected to deliver the goods again.

The Kiwis will have to deal with an overall hostile Indian team and an intimidating Wankhede stage in the semifinal.

Tough job for Pakistan as they face England

Nothing less than a miracle will help Pakistan as they face a near-impossible task of making the semifinals by winning an unthinkable margin, while a charged-up England will look to qualify for the Champions Trophy when the two sides clash in the World Cup here on Saturday.

New Zealand's net run-rate boosting five wicket-win over Sri Lanka has virtually shattered Pakistan's semifinal hopes. The 1992 champions now have to beat England by an improbable margin.

New Zealand's NRR is +0.036, and for the Babar Azam-led side to eclipse the former to qualify as the fourth side, it has to win by around 287 runs batting first. While chasing, Pakistan need to win with 284 balls to spare. That is an impractical task.

For defending champions England, the World Cup title defence dream may have been over for quite a sometime now but the Jos Buttler-led side will aim to finish inside top-8 to make the cut for the 2025 Champions Trophy.

As things stand, it's a four-way race with Bangladesh,

Sri Lanka and the Netherlands also in the mix with England.

A win against Pakistan should seal the spot, considering that both Bangladesh and the Netherlands face tough opponents in Australia and India respectively, and also have inferior NRRs than England.

About a month separated England from their first and last win in the global showpiece. In between, they lost five matches in a row to see their World Cup campaign go up in smoke.

Ben Stokes and David Malan have done well in the previous two games and it will be an interesting battle against the likes of Shaheen Shah Afridi and Hasan Rauf.

Australia hope to continue their fine run

Proteas make shortwork of Afghans

Quinton de Kock nabs six victims behind the stumps; equals record

An unbeaten half-century from Rassie van der Dussen and a 64-run partnership for the opening wicket between Quinton de Kock and Temba Bavuma helped South Africa defeat Afghanistan by five wickets, in their last league match of the World Cup here on Friday.

Chasing 245 for victory, the Proteas, who have already qualified for the semifinals, completed the task in 47.3 overs. They now have 14 points and continue to occupy the second spot behind India, who are on 16 points.

De Kock (41) and Bavuma (23) gave the Proteas the early push before Van der Dussen scored an unbeaten 76 off 95 balls to guide the team home.

Earlier, Azmatullah Omarzai hit a gritty unbeaten 97 as Afghanistan posted a challenging 244 all out in 50 overs. The South

African bowlers dominated the proceedings with Gerald Coetzee grabbing four wickets for 44 runs. Lungi Ngidi (2/69) and spinner Keshav Maharaj (2/25) took two wickets each.

The opening pair of Rahmanullah Gurbaz and Ibrahim Zadran had earlier given Afghanistan a decent

start with a 41-run partnership.

Ibrahim Zadran, who scored a brilliant hundred against Australia done in by a short ball from Coetzee, the batter giving a catch to De Kock after edging his attempted pull shot. De Kock finished with a record six catches behind the stumps.
